DANIEL  
Daniel prays upon his knees three times a day and prays, and gone thence before his God. — Dan. 6-10.

King Darius of Babylon appointed ~~not~~ Daniel one of three presidents over his kingdom as he was distinct over the other two and the king thought to set him over the whole realm. Then the other presidents became jealous of Daniel and persuaded the king to make an edict that

any man who asked a petition  
of any god or ~~except the king for~~  
30 days should be cast into  
the den of lions.

Paul disregard'd the  
edict and prop'd a vision  
to his God, was uporr to both  
King, who, much to his  
regret and execrion, had  
him cast into the lions  
den.

"Now, the King spoke  
and said unto Paul,  
Thy God whom thou servest  
continually, he will deliver  
thee. And a stone was

brought, and laid upon the  
mouth of the den; and the  
King sealed it with his own  
Seal, and with the Seal  
of his lords; that nothing  
might be changed concerning  
Daniel. Then the King went  
to his palace, and passed the  
night fasting; for neither were  
instruments of music brought  
before him; and his sleepless  
from him.

Then the King arose very  
early in the morning, and  
went in haste unto the den  
of lions. And when he came  
near unto the den to Daniel,  
he cried with a lamentable

Voice', the King spake—  
Said to Daniel, O, Daniel,  
Servant of the living God's  
thy God, whom thou servest  
continually, able to deliver thee  
from the lions? The said Daniel  
unto the King, O King, liveth  
for ever. My God hath sent  
thee's angel, and hath shut the  
lions mouthes, and their hands  
not hurt me; for as much  
as before him innocency  
was found in me; and before  
thee, O King, I have done  
no hurt.

Accordinging ~~to~~ glad, and commanded  
that they should take Daniel up  
out of the den. So Daniel was  
taken up out of the den, and  
no manner of hurt was  
found upon him, because he  
had trusted in his God."

children of the captivity of Judah,  
regarded not the King,  
nor the interdict that there  
was signed, but made it  
his petition three times  
a day."

"Daniel, when he was  
 prisoner in Babylon, appeals  
 to God for spiritual discern-  
 ment that he might interpret  
 the King's strange dream,  
~~which~~ <sup>After</sup> all the Chaldean  
 wise men had failed.  
 He began by blessing  
 the wisdom and discernment  
 of God, thus building up a  
 consciousness of God's wisdom  
 and understanding.

"And Daniel blessed the  
 God of Heaven.  
 Blessed be the name  
 of God forever and ever,  
 for wisdom and might  
 are his, ++ he revealeth

the deep and secret things;  
the ignorant what is in the  
darkness, and the light  
dwelt not with him.

I thank thee and praise  
thee, O God thou art my  
father, who has given me  
wisdom and insight, and  
hast now made known  
unto me what were  
desires of thee; for  
thou hast made known  
unto me the thing's  
matter."
