Wednesday

Dear Dad: —

Tomorrow we leave  
the bad sea waves for  
a better climate, we  
shall go to New York  
Friday and Howard is  
going to New Graduate  
the city. Saturday  
afternoon we leave New York  
we shall stay all night  
Sunday in Chicago and  
Monday morning Graduate  
goes to Milwaukee and  
I shall spend the day  
looking at machinery in  
Chicago, arriving at home

Tuesday morning on the  
Milwaukee train.  
While in N.Y. we shall  
stay at the Unity Center.  
Sudhatha is getting along  
fine & she feels well  
and navigates very steadily.

Nearly every day we take  
her out in the sand

umbrella to protect her  
I'm enclosing pictures  
of her lying on the sand in front of
